

PROGRAMME SPECIALISATION YEAR

CONDITIONS

Minimum age: 21

In order to apply for the Specialization programme, students need to have a thorough knowledge of photoshop, illustrator and indesign as well as a good understanding of calligraphy and typography. This programme is designed for ELI who completed their foundation course, wanting to continue for one more year, deepening their knowledge of specific subject matters or filling in some gaps. It also opens its doors to students holding a graphic design degree, or any equivalent degree in the graphic, lettering and book arts, who are looking for a tailor made programme.

SUBJECT AREAS

This programme is completely based around the student needs and wishes. Subject matters will be discussed with the director before agreement. Students will be guided in their individual tuition programme by professionals, allowing them to move forward at their own pace, dealing only with subject matters important to them. Upon graduating, students wishing to continue to study at ELI can move onto the second year postgraduate programme.

SUBSCRIPTION FEES 2018-2019:

Full-time	3 days / week	5450 euros (all seminars included)
Part-time	2 days / week	3625 euros (all seminars included)
Part-time	1,5 day / week	2725 euros (seminars not included)

Students can apply for a one day/week programme, with possible added Skype sessions, but this can only be granted in exceptional circumstances and is not encouraged, fearing a loss of important and necessary teaching time. However, should you be interested, please contact us via email.

HOW TO APPLY:

Please send us your CV and a motivation letter via mail. We will contact you and if favourable, you will receive an invitation to show your work in our school. It will give us the opportunity to get to know you better. For students living abroad, this appointment can be replaced by a Skype meeting. ELI students who finished their foundation course don't need to apply again, but can notify us of their desire to sign up for this programme. You will be sent the subscription papers together with your evaluation at the end of the academic year.

Overseas students will need a visa to study in Belgium. Since regulations have become more strict, we advise you to please contact us for more details **before** contacting the Embassy. Please note that it takes upto at least 8 weeks before receiving your visa.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION:

The school opens at 9:00am and closes on course days at 5:30pm.
Classes take place on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30am till 4:30pm.
School holidays are to be found online and students will be informed well in time should changes occur.

Students can use the school library during opening hours. No books can be taken home.
All courses take place -unless stated otherwise- in Brugge, Peterseliestraat 23A, Belgium.
