PROGRAMME FOUND YEAR 2

CONDITIONS

Students who passed their evaluation in year 1 can now move on to year 2. A more in depth and personal approach is key in this second year. We focus on individual and team work. Individual feedback will be given on the work done. Students need to have a basic understanding of illustrator and indesign. They will be evaluated in February and June before moving on to the third year. Part-time students also need to finish all projects before they can be admitted in year 3, meaning one year full-time equals two years part-time.

HOW TO APPLY:

Please send us your CV and a motivation letter via mail. We will contact you and if favourable, you will receive an invitation to show your work in our school. It will give us the opportunity to get to know you better. For students living abroad, this appointment can be replaced by a Skype meeting. Overseas students will need a visa to study in Belgium. Since regulations have become more strict, we advise you to please contact us for more details **before** contacting the Embassy. Please note that it takes upto at least 8 weeks before receiving your visa.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION:

The school opens at 9:00am and closes on course days at 5:30pm.
Classes take place on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30am till 4:30pm.
School holidays are to be found online and students will be informed well in time should changes occur.
